# 1. Integration of Ancient wisdom in modern education:

The old mythological books preserved by ancient civilizations should not be questioned in terms of their trustworthiness. The more important question is whether the knowledge preserved thoughs written in these books can be absorbed into our daily lives in a positive way.



The 'ILLID' and 'Odyssey' are the Greek mythological epics in which humans are depicted with wings. In my opinion, these representations are a product of human imagination. The ancients may have created this imagery to differentiate between the disciplies of God, portraying them with white wings as a sign of positive vibes and as knowledge-givers to the people of that period.

The topic for discussion should be whether we can apply the knowledge provided by these texts to our current lifestyles. We should strive to understand and absorb the deeper meanings of their words and deeds. In the case studies I have mentioned the relevance of their actions in today's corporate sector and on social media platforms.

### 2. Personal journey in academia:

In my 35-year career, I have treated all my students, assistants, and costaff members as equals, without any kind of discrimination. It does not matter if one is closer to me or if another is more outgoing; I have never made distinctions. No one has the right to do this to anyone. Everyone has positive skills as well as negative aspects. In the world, no one is 100 percent correct nor 100 percent wrong. According to Indian Vedas, there are 14 vidyas and 64 kalas, making a grand total of 78. Keeping in mind today's world, the 79th kala is advertising. From these, everyone has some skill segment within them. The thing is, one may not be aware of that aspect of their skills. As one explores the world, they might discover their inner talents as they grow older. Sometimes, a person may realize the same in their late 20s or 30s. A person pursuing a

specific degree is not limited to that field. For example, the author of Sherlock Holmes was a dentist, and a chartered accountant might be interested in sketching. There is no rule that if one enters a specific field, that person should be limited to that field. In the past, people drew lines between various specializations, such as Science, Commerce, and Arts, and categorized them, giving limitations to those subjects. In my opinion, one should complete their basic education and pursue with his / her most prominent qualities. It is much easier to criticize or point out mistakes.

Anyone can express their opinion, as we live in a democratic nation. When one tries to acknowledge other's good inner qualities and helps them realize their self-worth, the bond between two individuals enhances. One does not need to adopt different forms of leadership along the way.

When you talk to a human being with humanity, a positive attitude, and positive energy, it helps to connect with the people around you.

When you truly put in the effort to see activities without a critical opinion, you will reach the reality.

When Prince Charles of England visited, he observed Mumbai's dabbawalas. The way these people, wearing white hats and applying a tilak on their foreheads, managed the synchronized system daily ensuring that the correct person received the correct tiffin without any misplacement or wrong delivery amazed the prince.

Even though these people were uneducated, they managed their service in such an error-free manner. After Prince Charles's recognition, the business of the dabbawalas gained social recognition.

### 3. Balancing diverse interests:

I am a member of the Dombivali Gymkhana, where I actively engage in sports activities. When college students come with an enthusiastic vision to participate in sports tournaments, I make an effort to enlist these events in the newspaper and share them with the college management. I also post about these activities on social media platforms like Instagram and Facebook. With a strong interest in culture, I motivate students to participate as much as they can to find their fit.

Gaining recognition on a wider scale can significantly motivate individuals towards personal enhancement. The age between 11 and 22 is a crucial period of development, spanning from the first year of junior college to post-graduation. During this time, students form critical opinions about various aspects of life, which can be either positive or negative. To mitigate this scenario, I encourage students to actively participate in sports, cultural committees, the Rotaract Club, and the National Service Scheme (NSS). This involvement helps them recognize the diversity around them rather than adopting a one-sided perspective.

My philosophy and psychology are rooted in the belief that every student has potential. They are all here to learn different activities alongside their academic pursuits.

Sometimes, students may engage in wrongful deeds, such as cheating in exams or becoming addicted to unethical means. However, this does not define them as bad individuals. Every parent envisions their child as a person of great deeds and a successful career. When parents pay their children's fees, they often have a secret aim: that their child should receive a quality education that leads to success, whether in a job or business, while also becoming a genuine citizen.

I have led the NSS for 11 years, organized camps, and managed various aspects of the program, which has been invaluable in identifying positive opportunities today.

### 4. Vision for future generations:

I have noticed that students who study in English medium or in vernacular medium often do not possess a comprehensive vocabulary in English or in local language. They tend to hybridize their regional language with English. Typically, they do not read entire English books or stay updated with general knowledge or mythological literature in any language. Instead, they spend most of their time on social media or using technology in ways that do not contribute to acquiring the right set of knowledge. When individuals invest their time on social media platforms, they miss out on opportunities to read books or gain insights related to their careers, making it more challenging for them to make informed career choices.

Secondly, in business or profession ,the sole objective should not be merely making money. One should also have a life objective—a path on which they can walk. As humans, we have various dimensions; we are not robots. It is essential to define an objective for yourself, an aim that you wish to achieve in the future. Alongside your main plan, it is also wise to have alternative options, such as Plan B and Plan C, ready.

In the field of Commerce, it is common for students to opt for CA, CMA & CS exams. While this is a valuable certification, some of these students do not have any alternate plans for themselves. They simply continue to attempt the exams, which can lead to feelings of depression.

In business or a job, one should not always consider money as the sole purpose. Other factors, such as personal development and skills upgrading, also matters significantly.

Individuals should recognize their inner talents without comparing themselves to others. They should choose the best career for themselves, one where they enjoy the work and feel suited to excel.

### 5.Upcoming publications:

With a background I have cordial relations with police department and political leaders too.

Already I have written books on Indian mythology and management aspects in the same. I am planning to write many more books on the same subject. Indian knowledge system (IKS) introduced by National Education policy (NEP) is the best way to connect Indian youths to greater Indian Culture.


In college, he was a great actor and played several roles in plays like 'Rana Pratap' and 'Bharat-Durdasha'.


# Wise and Otherwise: A salute to Life


